What’s Happening Around Town?

In August 2010, Angier Parks and Recreation was awarded a grant from PARTF (Parks and Recreation Trust Fund), for Phase II Jack Marley Park Improvements. Items to be included from grant proceeds will include fitness stations along perimeter of walking trail, shuffleboard courts, new pavilion shelter with picnic tables, new landscaping, new spray fountain in lake, new benches, additional parking and renovations to skatepark. Work will begin in Spring, 2011.

The next phase of sidewalk construction will take place at Angier Elementary School on McIver Street. New curb and gutter, sidewalk and lighting

will be installed as the Town continues its efforts to become a safe, walkable village.

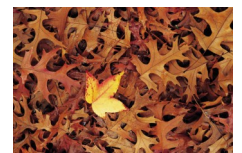

Curbside Recycling and Leaf Collection



Curbside recycling within the corporate limits of Angier began on July 1st at a cost of \$3 per month. Reception of recycling has been great as we are taking steps to save our environment. Recycling carts should have been delivered to each residence by this time, so if you have not received your container, please contact Town Hall at 639-

2071. The Town will begin its annual leaf collection in November and continue through mid-February, 2011. Residents may place loose leaves and pine straw that are free of limbs, sticks, rocks and other debris at the curb. Do not place leaves in the street where they may interfere with traffic or drainage! Do not block sidewalks or fire hydrants. Do not bag leaves during this period.

Please place leaves at the curb by late Sunday evening and they should be picked up during the following week. The trash collection and recycling information is posted on the Town’s website or available at Town Hall.

Police Department-Domestic Violence Information Assistance

In recent months, the North Carolina General Assembly has legislated to law enforcement more responsibility in reference to Domestic Violence. The statute states that a law enforcement officer must provide the victim of domestic violence information of how to get medical treatment, the possibility of monetary assistance with medical bills through the State of North Carolina. If you or someone you love is involved in a domestic violence situation, the

Angier Police Department wants to ensure your safety and provide you with all information available to you for your medical and safety needs. You may call S.A.F.E. of Harnett County 24 hours a day Crisis Line-910-893-7233. The Angier Police Department is here to assist you in any way possible. We are located at 55 N. Broad St., Angier or you may call Harnett County Dispatch at 911 if an emergency or non-emergency 910-893-9111, and they will have an

officer respond to your location or call you if a non-emergency. The office hours of the Police Department are 8 a.m.-5 p.m. Monday-Friday and you may call 919-639-2699 during those hours.

Police Ride-Along Program & Property Theft Inventory Program

If you are interested in riding along with a police officer, please contact the Police Department at 639-2699. This will be a great opportunity to experience the life of a police officer for a few hours. A simple ride along waiver will need to be completed to take advantage of this opportunity.

The Police Department offers a Property Theft Inventory

Program. This program assists residents with making a list of their valuables in case they are stolen. The Police Department has an inventory form where you can list your valuables to include the make, model, serial number, or owner applied number. If you become a victim of theft, this form helps expedite reimbursement for your loss through your insurance company and will assist law en-

forcement in having a better opportunity to recover your property. This program includes a Police Officer coming to your home, helping you complete the inventory form, taking photos of your property and engraving your driver's license number on your property if requested. Code Enforcement

Great strides have been taken to clean up the town of dilapidated buildings and other violations. During the next few months, concentration of code enforcement will be stressed on properties with overgrown weeds and brush. The Town Code reads as follows:

Any weeds or other vegetation having an overall height of more than 12 inches above the surrounding ground shall be considered a violation. Every owner or person in possession of a vacant lot within the corporate limits shall shrub down, within twelve (12) inches of the ground, all weeds, grass, or

other noxious growth from said lot as needed to remain in compliance with the ordinance. Should you have questions regarding the Nuisance Ordinance as it relates to weeded lots or receive a Violation Citation, contact Code Enforcement Officer Mike Hill at 639-2071.

Town Code of Ordinances & Unified Development Ordinance Online

Citizens can now access the Town of Angier Code of Ordinances, as well as the Unified Development Ordinance online. These ordinances were recently updated and we encourage you to use this method of access, which is available online for convenience only, as there is a possibility that recent amendments may not appear online. The official Town Code of Ordinances and Unified Development Ordinance is located at Town Hall. The Unified Development Ordinance combines the

Food Pantry and Food Drive

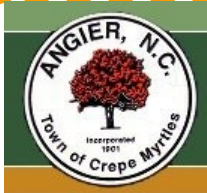

Monday-Friday. In case of police or utility emergencies AFTER HOURS, call 910-893-9111 and a Public Works employee will be contacted or a Police Officer will be dispatched.

Please roll your garbage containers to the curb prior to the night before your scheduled pick-up. If your garbage is not picked up, contact Town Hall at 639-2071. All carts must be removed from the curb by 7 p.m. on day of scheduled pick-up; this is STRICTLY ENFORCED by the Code Enforcement Officer.

Note that your container's handle MUST face your house and the lid MUST face the street when you place it out by the curb. If you have questions or if your garbage is not picked up on the scheduled day, please do not hesitate to contact Customer Service at 639-2071. GENERAL ELECTION INFORMATION:

Black River Precinct will vote in the Angier Municipal Building located at 28 N. Raleigh Street in Angier. Polls will be open on November 2, 2010 from 6:30 a.m. until 7:30 p.m. Voters already registered to vote need not re-register. Residents who are not registered to vote 30 days prior to the election MAY NOT vote in this election. Any voter who has moved since the last election must make that change with the Board of Elections Office by the same date. A person may register to vote at the Board of Elections Office located at 817 S. 8th Street, Lillington, NC between the hours of 8:00 a.m. and 5:00 p.m. Monday-Friday and during one-stop voting as provided by law. For General Election and voting questions, contact Harnett County Board of Elections at 910-893-7553.
