



## North Carolina Project & Timeline Information










Overview - Angier, NC Projected Network Footprint

#### **Materials & Equipment**



"Flowerpot"

- One placed for every two residents serviced.

"Handhole"

- Typically located at road crossings or areas where the network branches multiple directions.

#### "FST"

- The location where up to 48 surrounding residents are serviced from with dedicated lines for each resident.

- Concrete or composite versions of each box are available where necessary.





#### **Materials & Equipment**


#### "FDH"

- Pictured is our largest "Fiber distribution hub" where up to 576 residents can be serviced.




- Our FDH's represent the only above ground feature in the network. All other structures are installed at ground level.


- Ting utilizes conduits of varying sizes. Each containing smaller ducts internally.
- Pictured are some of the most common sizes.








